



It is the responsibility of the Class A/B Operator to train Class C individuals. Class C operators must be trained to address emergencies presented by a spill or release from an underground storage tank system prior to taking daily responsibility. They must be able to shut-off fuel pumps in case of emergency and able to respond to other warnings and alarms and also be able to contact DENR.

**What does a Class C Operator Need to Know in an Emergency?**

- What is a spill or release?
- Where is the shutoff switch or breaker for the dispensers/pumps?
- Who to call?
- Where is the absorbent material? Sandbags? Spill kit?
- What to do about an alarm?

**What Does a Class C Operator Need To Do in an Emergency?**

- If there is a fire, call 911 first
- Stop the release of product from the UST system
- Contain the release so it doesn't go down a storm drain, in the grass or off the property
- Call the main office or supervisor
